



### **Postdoctoral fellowship on developmental psychopathology and gender-based stereotypes Département de psychoéducation, Université de Sherbrooke**

The stigma and psychosocial development research team is offering a full-time, 12-months postdoctoral fellowship, renewable for one year. The position is a research-intensive appointment in the Department of Psychoeducation at the Université de Sherbrooke. The postdoctoral fellow will take advantage of multiple longitudinal databases to study childhood factors (ex., temperament, history of conduct problems), gender factors (ex., gender presentation and identity, gender non-conformity), and experiences of stigma (i.e., gender-based discrimination, homophobia) to understand adolescent and early adult mental health and wellbeing.

Mentorship will be provided by Dr Alexa Martin-Storey, a Tier 2 CRC in Stigma and Psychosocial Development ([web page](#)), and Dr Jean-Pascal Lemelin, both professors in the Department of Psychoeducation at the Université de Sherbrooke. The candidate will also collaborate with other members of the Groupe de recherche et d'intervention sur les adaptations sociales de l'enfance (GRISE, [website](#)) and the Centre de recherche universitaire sur les jeunes et les familles (CRUJeF, [website](#)).

#### **Working environment :**

The postdoctoral fellow will benefit from a strong research environment with the CRC, the GRISE, a recognized research center funded by the Université de Sherbrooke, and the CRUJeF, a research institute affiliated to the Centre intégré universitaire de santé et de services sociaux (CIUSSS) de la Capitale-Nationale funded by the Fonds de Recherche du Québec - Société et Culture. The GRISE and the CRUJeF conduct cutting-edge research on children and adolescents' behavior and adjustment problems, and on the psychosocial interventions designed to address these difficulties.

#### **The candidate will be expected to :**

- write scientific papers;
- conduct quantitative analyses using longitudinal databases;
- contribute to external funding applications;
- contribute to various research dissemination activities in scientific and clinical settings;
- support undergraduate (e.g., summer internship), master and PhD students (e.g., provide support for scholarship applications, statistical analyses, etc.).

**Requirements :**

- PhD in psychoeducation, developmental psychology, education, or related fields;
- Expertise and autonomy in longitudinal data analysis or other quantitative developmental research methods;
- CV reflecting a strong potential for research;
- Strong interest in working as a collaborative team member on various research projects;
- A good sense of priorities and a time-efficient work ethic;
- Excellent writing and oral communication skills in English.

**Salary and conditions :**

45,000\$ CAD per annum (possibility of renewal).

- one recent published scientific article on a related topic;
