The GRISE is a research center attached to the Department of Psychoeducation at the Université de Sherbrooke. The postdoctoral fellow will take advantage of multiple databases to study the alternative model of personality disorders, the assessment and structure of normal and pathological personality, and the development of personality disorders, with special consideration for sex and gender. Depending on the interest of the postdoctoral fellow, their research can take a developmental psychopathology, a personality theory (normal and pathological) or a personality assessment perspective. Mentorship will be provided by Pr Yann Le Corff (website), Pr Mélanie Lapalme (website) and Pr Vincent Bégin (website), all three members of the GRISE. The postdoctoral fellow will also be encouraged to collaborate with other members of the GRISE.

- Write scientific papers;
- Conduct advanced statistical analyses;
- Contribute to external funding applications;
- Contribute to various research dissemination activities in scientific and clinical settings;
- Occasionally support undergraduate (e.g., summer internship), master and PhD students (e.g., provide support for scholarship applications, statistical analyses, etc.);
- Commit to apply for postdoctoral fellowships to relevant granting agencies.

REQUIREMENTS:

- PhD in psychoeducation, psychology, criminology, education, or related fields;
- Expertise and autonomy in advanced statistical analysis (notably structural equation modeling);
- CV reflecting a strong potential for research;
- Strong interest in working as a collaborative team member on various research projects;
- A good sense of priorities and a time-efficient work ethic;
- Excellent writing and oral communication skills.
